Director's Note

Late night trips to 7 eleven. Golden hour. Sunsets. Streetlights. The way it feels to be riding through the night on a bike. Holding hands. A slap across the face. Floating on your back in water. Slushees. Fighting. Brushing things off. The intimacy of being understood. Being unable to express how you truly feel. Your deepest darkest secret. The thing that you've never said out loud. Resigning to the truth you think you have to live. Best friends. The glow.

Poolside Glow, to me, is a coming-of-age story that leaves you heartbroken. The kind that makes your heart burn a little. Like when you have been swimming and open your eyes under water and cry right after, that kind of burn. Poolside Glow has this effect on me, because there is no sugar coating. No "we can't put that on stage, people won't like it". It's raw, it's real and it encapsulates the experience that real people have in America. It doesn't just show the pretty parts, but the ugly parts too.

There will be parts of this play that you don't like, I can guarantee it. And that's okay. It's supposed to be that way. This play hit me so hard when I first read it, because it forces you to live in a world where two seemingly opposite things can be true at the same time. That's the most heartbreaking thing to me. As much as we wish we could isolate feelings of hate, fear, and love, sometimes we can't. Sometimes you feel all three, plus 5 more. Poolside Glow makes you jump headfirst into the deep end of some of the best and worst parts of being a young adult in America. I hope you find yourself in the pauses. In the silences. And I hope that you too, find your glow.

Playwright's Note

Poolside Glow was the first play I wrote that made me feel like, "Hey, I think I found my voice" – and since then, the development of it has been a journey of love. It is a play about what we as people think we deserve, what we want, and how much we are and aren't willing to sacrifice for it.

This play takes us through three moments in time between Aunie and Serena, each time cemented by the music at the top of each scene, guiding us through these characters' lives. It comes to an end with a song I believe to be an important message about how this story ends. Touching on what it means to be alive, to be a woman in this moment in time, and the fear that comes with living outside what is labeled as "normal".

More often than not, we deserve so much more than we believe. We accept what we have been conditioned to think is the "right" thing, letting it control our lives, telling us how we aren't enough because the world around us has always, as far as we know, and always will put us down. Hopefully you see a little bit of yourself, no matter where you come from or where you're going.
